



LETTER OF EXPECTATION

This is the Letter of Expectation ("LOE") from April 1, 2024, until March 31, 2025, between the Tla-o-qui-aht First Nation and the Tofino RCMP Detachment.

JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Meetings between the Tla-o-qui-aht First Nation leadership and the Tofino RCMP Detachment Commander (or delegate) will occur, at minimum, once per quarter.
2. The RCMP monthly policing report (ED78) will be presented in person or sent via email to the Band Administrator, Justice Manager and/or Elected Chief each month.
3. New employees at the RCMP Detachment will review an orientation package that includes information pertaining to the Tla-o-qui-aht First Nation, and new employees will discuss community expectations with the Detachment Commander.
4. The Tla-o-qui-aht First Nation will notify the Detachment Commander of any event the community wishes for the RCMP to attend. When possible, notice will be provided at least 4 weeks prior to the event to allow for scheduling flexibility by the RCMP.

INITIATIVES

The priorities that are agreed to by the Tla-o-qui-aht First Nation Community and the Tofino RCMP Detachment Commander include:

1. Reconciliation/Youth Engagement
2. Impaired Operation of Vehicles and Speeding
3. Impaired Operation of Vessels and Patrols of Opitsaht

(Please Note: Initiatives and action plans can be adjusted during the term of the Letter of Expectation if both parties are consulted, and they are both in agreement to do so.)

ACTION PLAN (Reconciliation/Youth):

1. Quarterly visits to the elementary school in Tofino, with presentations on the safety topics: who to call for help in an emergency, bullying, internet safety, physical safety, drugs/alcohol abuse, road safety, or, any other topic as suggested by school staff.
 - a. The Detachment Commander will request a presentation to high school students by Indigenous Police Services.

2. Attendance by RCMP Members at community functions when invited.
3. The Detachment Commander will partake in Tla-o-qui-aht Justice Committee meetings as requested by the Justice Manager.
4. Regular communication between the Tla-o-qui-aht Council, Justice Committee, Band Administrator and the Tofino Detachment Commander to ensure transparency, information sharing and collaborative approaches to community issues.
5. Tracking of this initiative will be provided to Tla-o-qui-aht First Nation by way of the monthly ED 78 reporting.


ACTION PLAN (Impaired Operation of Vehicles and Speeding):

1. RCMP Members will complete, on average, 1 proactive enforcement initiative per month to target impaired driving within or around Ty-Histanis and Esowista.
 - a. The Tofino RCMP will request assistance from specialized units to assist with enforcement, particularly the Impaired Driving Unit.
2. RCMP Members will complete, on average, 1 proactive enforcement initiative per month to target speeding within or around Ty-Histanis and Esowista.
 - a. The Tofino RCMP will request assistance from specialized units to assist with enforcement, particularly BC Highway Patrol.
3. The Tofino RCMP Detachment Commander will engage the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure regarding electronic signage within the community.
4. Tracking of this initiative will be provided to Tla-o-qui-aht First Nation by way of the monthly ED 78 reporting.

ACTION PLAN (Impaired Operation of Vessels and Patrols of Opitsaht):

1. RCMP Members will complete, on average, 1 proactive enforcement initiative per month to target impaired boating between Tofino and Opitsaht.
 - a. The Tofino RCMP will request assistance from specialized units to assist with enforcement, particularly West Coast Marine Services.
2. RCMP Members will complete, on average, 1 proactive foot patrol per month through Opitsaht to increase visibility and encourage community connection.
 - a. The Detachment Commander will be the primary contact between police and the Opitsaht First Responders.
3. Tracking of this initiative will be provided to Tla-o-qui-aht First Nation by way of the monthly ED 78 reporting.
