

Coho Creek (aka Morningstar Creek)

The Central West Coast Forest Society and Pacific Rim National Park Reserve have restored this creek to allow for the return of wild Coho Salmon and Cutthroat Trout.

- Bacteria from the carcasses of fish not from this stream may harm or kill fish who were born and return here.
- Fish carcasses left above low tide are wildlife attractants. It is illegal to leave out attractants in a National Park.
- It is illegal to dump the remains of fish and marine animals above the low tide (see below).

NO DISPOSAL of FISH or SHELLFISH REMAINS ABOVE LOW TIDE.

FISHERIES ACT

Throwing overboard of certain substances prohibited

36 (1) No one shall

(b) leave or deposit or cause to be thrown, left or deposited, on the shore, beach or bank of any water or on the beach between high and ow water mark, remains or offal of fish or of marine animals;

Currently we have 12 students in the program and they are a mixture of Tla-o-qui-aht and Ucluelet First Nation Students. They began March to June, with a summer break.



Maker of Monsters strives to unearth the factors that made Beau who he was – his deep connection to identity, family, and community, his struggle with addiction – and like a carver chipping away at a block of wood, his story brings truth and understanding out of the woodwork.
